I have been a Lutheran – a church goer – all of my life. I was baptized, confirmed and married in the same church that still sits out in the middle of the country in southeast Nebraska. I have been married for 35 years – we have 2 sons and 3 beautiful grandchildren.

Shortly after I was married – I recommitted my life to God. I belonged to a church that reconnected me. Then came a baby, moving away from our families and losing some of the “fire” that had been re-ignited. We have always belonged to a church and served in some way – but didn’t have Christ at the core of our lives. More moves, another child, jobs and activities – and God was slowly getting squelched out of my life. The importance of Him in my life was diminishing.

In 2007 – I was laid off my job. I began re-evaluating my life. I looked at myself and these are the things I saw: I was depressed, anxious, offended easily, fearful, guarded – I could go on – the point is – I had a lot more bad days than good ones. I was going through the motions – trying and striving to do the right things – but it wasn’t working. I realized – the only time I opened my Bible – was in church or for a Bible study.

About this same time we started attending T!LC. I was still lost – so I began trying to get connected at church. I joined a couple of groups and it helped me get to know people and feel like a part of something. Then I began taking several classes – the Cleansing Stream course, attending Sunday morning classes – I continued to seek Him. In December 2013 – I went through RTF as a ministry receiver. It is still difficult for me to express how freeing this experience was for me – but I think Proverbs 3:5-6 sums it up – “Trust in the Lord with all of your heart and do not rely on your own understanding – acknowledge Him in all your ways and He will make your paths straight”. I get a visual



picture of a tangled, winding, mess of a road when I was trying to lead my life and a picture of a straight as an arrow road when I surrender it all to God and let Him lead it.

As I kept knocking - the doors continued to open up for me . . . the doors to a relationship with God that I now experience every day!

My life isn't perfect – but I now have some of the tools I need to be aware of when I am being attacked by the enemy and how to deal with it. Where I am today didn't happen overnight – it's been a journey with many twists and turns.

Now - the most important part of my day is spending time with God. One of the most precious gifts God gives us – His time with us. Sometimes it's the thing we covet the most – our time – or at least it was for me.

As I look back – I see when I seek Him – He meets me where I am. He met me where I was 7 years ago – a wounded, hopeless, striving Christian. I believe that God made me in HIS image – and if I do believe that – then I know He didn't make me to be fearful, prideful, or judgmental.

I am a journaler - so I want to share an entry I made on January 20, 2014 (about a month after my RTF experience) as it kind of sums up my journey . . .so far. . .

As I was sitting on the couch and looking out the window – I saw the hard, sharp, pokey branches swirling in the wind – but behind them was the beautiful sky – calm with puffy white clouds and very peaceful. Because of what I know about God and the seasons – God will turn those hard, brittle branches into soft, beautiful green leaves in the spring. Then it will be easier to walk through them and not get scratched and battered by the hard branches. Be patient – wait on the Lord. God will do the transforming of the hard into the soft. He will make HIS path easier to follow. It will be full of calmness and peace on the other side of the hardness.

PASTOR'S PAGE

The 2015 Annual Meeting of the Congregation is February 7, at 6:30 pm. We will begin our evening at 5:30 pm to worship together. The message time will be used to hear testimonies of how God is working in and through the people of T!LC. Then, at 6:30 pm, we will convene the business portion of our meeting (child care will be available) with the following action items on the agenda.

- ◆ Vote to elect three persons to the Congregation Council.
- ◆ Vote to elect two persons to the 2015 Nominating Committee.
- ◆ Vote on the Proposed 2015 Budget.

Candidate Bios and copies of the Proposed 2015 Budget will be available in the lobby of the building and on our website under the About Us tab.

Ash Wednesday is February 18, and marks the beginning of the liturgical season of **Lent** – the 40 days, not counting Sundays, which lead up to the celebration of Easter. Our Ash Wednesday worship service schedule will be as follows:

- ◆ 6:30 am – Devotional Service, with Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion
- ◆ 6:00 pm – Full Service, with Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion
- ◆ 7:30 pm – Full Service, with Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion

Ashes in the Jewish and Christian traditions are a sign of God's judgment and condemnation of sin. The "imposition of ashes" on our foreheads, therefore, is meant to be a visible reminder to us – the Body of Christ – that we are frail sinners entering into a season of reflection, confession, and repentance.

Lent is from an Anglo-Saxon word meaning 'springtime' and so is to be understood as the holy springtime of the soul, a time for preparation, planting, and growth" – (LBW – Manual on the Liturgy) . The ancient custom of burning fields in the springtime to destroy the old and to prepare for new life is therefore also related to the ashes imposed on Ash Wednesday.

Fasting was practiced for 40 days in the early church by converts preparing for baptism at Easter. This practice of fasting, which also is meant to remind us of Jesus' 40 day fast before his baptism, is also a spiritual discipline still kept by many Christians during the season of Lent. Many believers will fast from some kind(s) of food or drink as a personal reminder of the spiritual preparations they are making during this season.

Other Lenten Disciplines which are now being chosen by some Christians may include a specific prayer focus, a commitment to acts or words of kindness, or the "giving up" of television or some other enjoyable activity which causes that believer to remember and to reflect on the perfect sacrifice of Jesus.

Mid-Week Lenten Services will be held on Thursday evenings during Lent at 6:30 pm. We will be using Voices, by J. B. Quisenberry. Each week you will hear a short dramatic dialogue between *Everybody* (representing each of us) and a biblical figure. Each of these dialogues will be followed by a Lenten homily by one of the pastors. We will also have a children's message. **Note:** We are *not* planning to continue our Thursday 6:30 am devotional services this year during Lent.

Lenten Dinners will be served from 5pm to 6:15pm every Thursday before the midweek Lenten service. The meals will be served by different T!LC groups or ministries. Donations will be received to support the missional endeavors of each group.

Staying the Course

Is the name of our 2-year capital campaign that began the weekend of May 4, 2014. Like our former capital campaign, the goal of *Staying the Course* will be debt reduction as we continue to retire the mortgage on the Family Life Center. Estimates of giving received were; 102 estimates of giving for \$249,074 over a 2-year period. Actual contributions received through December were \$156,558.72 or 62.9% of the estimates of giving. Additional principal payments from the Pathway to Freedom campaign and *Staying the Course* campaign (May 2012-Dec. 2014) now total \$571,537.36 and will save approximately \$484,140 in interest payments over the loan period and effectively reduces the loan period by fifteen years. We will continue to make regular additional principal payments from the *Staying the Course* capital campaign as they are received.

Christmas Eve Offering

The total Christmas Eve offerings were \$23,484.00 and will be split between the Open Door Mission and the T!LC Emergency Fund to support individuals and families in need of assistance and/or shelter in our local community. Thank you Covenant/Kingdom partners for your generosity!

Happy New Year! Thank you to those of you who are using your offering envelopes. That really helps us record your contributions correctly. Need envelopes? We have some for you; contact Harold Carlson at the church office at 402-292-2695, or harold@thanks-giving.org.

Your envelopes have different numbers each year. For those of you making your gifts through online banking, if you update your envelope number in the template for T!LC, it will help us credit your payment to the correct person. Thank you for taking a minute to do that. You can also save a note in the template if you want your contribution split between funds.

Please list your current address on your checks, even if you need to hand-write it. We realize people move, and it takes time to get new checks printed. We want to send your giving statement to the correct address, and we strive to credit all of your contributions to the right person. Address changes and name changes can be noted on the attendance slips, as well, and the office staff will update your records.

A couple of notes about check writing . . . whether you are writing a check to T!LC, or anyone else, choose a pen with either black or blue ink. Modern check processing utilizes scanned images of your checks. Checks written with colored ink scan as blank checks. The colored ink on the check is invisible on the scanned image. Extra handling is required to process those checks. And while every check you write to T!LC will be processed for the intended amount, you can imagine that there is a heightened opportunity for fraud with a check that scans as blank. Just make it a habit - - always - - to use black or blue ink. If you are giving to a special offering, please make your check out to T!LC, with the designated fund noted on the memo line. And do take a moment, after writing any check, to confirm both of the amounts, the date, and your signature.

If you have an eye for detail, are a good proof-reader, can operate a ten-key adding machine or do data entry, we would welcome your help! If you are interested in trying out our ministry, contact me a jgladbach@cox.net, or 402-292-4201.

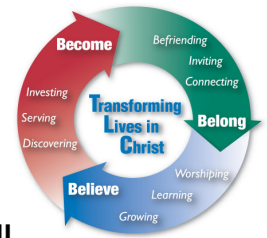

As you know, we raise money to purchase the supplies, and then we help pack the meals. A mere 25 cents buys a meal that is not only filled with nutrients, but also reverses the starvation process. T!LC, with the Lord's help, would like to feed as many people as we can, and to allow as many people as possible, to participate in the packing event.

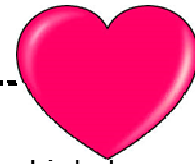

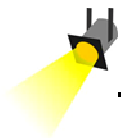

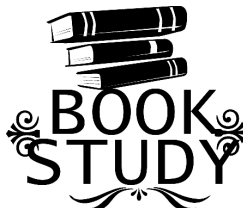
